

Julia L. Perilla, Ph.D., is a clinical community psychologist and Associate Research Professor in the Department of Psychology at Georgia State University. Her areas of interest include domestic violence, diversity issues, Latino families, and trauma. As Coordinator of Caminar *Latino* (a program of Saint Joseph's Mercy Care Services, the outreach arm of a Catholic hospital) since 1990, she has had extensive experience working with Latino families affected by domestic violence. Dr. Perilla serves as Director of *El Centro*: The national Latino Research Center on Domestic Violence at Georgia State University, a component of the National Latino Alliance for the Elimination of Domestic Violence. She is President of TAPESTRI: The Refugee and Immigrant Coalition to End Gender-Based Oppression and an appointee to the Georgia Commission on Family Violence. Since 1996 Dr. Perilla has collaborated with the Universidad de Guadalajara in Mexico in research and training projects regarding trauma and domestic violence issues. Dr. Perilla received the Georgia Commission on Family Violence 2001 Gender Justice Award for her work with immigrant populations affected by domestic violence.
