

**Jacquelyn L. Boggess** is the Senior Policy Analyst for The Center on Fathers, Families, and Public Policy. Ms. Boggess has worked with the Center since its inception in 1995. She is the Project Director for the Center's Legal Assistance project. Her work on this project includes research of state and federal child support and paternity establishment law and policy with a particular emphasis on its effect on low-income, never-married fathers. The Project is designed to provide legal information and education about child support to low-income parents. In addition, she has developed a Q&A legal resource, and co-authored a child support manual for parents and practitioners who have questions and concerns about child support and paternity establishment. Ms. Boggess has a particular interest in the impact of non-resident father involvement on mothers and children and she represents CFFPP in a partnership (the Common Ground Project) with the National Women's Law Center.
